ONLY the pioneers who took part in early efforts to develop thought and action between nations would really be able to appreciate fully the implications of the United Nations' decision to make 1965 the "International Co-operation Year".

It comes exactly a century and a half after generous-minded men battled to secure from the plenipotentiaries at the Congress of Vienna a proclamation abolishing the slave trade, and clear-minded economists persuaded them to recognize the principle of freedom of navigation on international rivers for the vessels of all nations.

A century and a half of bold initiatives, patient and devoted labours to overcome egoism, fear, and above all lack of understanding.

It is with our thoughts on all those who, since 1815, have led the world towards progress and unity, organizing international meetings and societies that we have dedicated this tenth edition of the Yearbook of International Organizations to International Co-operation Year.

The 179 inter-governmental and 1,718 non-governmental international organizations described in the present volume are the result of their faith and their work. The Who's Who in International Organizations, published as a supplement to the Yearbook, lists nearly 12,000 of the present leaders of these organizations. They represent in fact millions of people in all countries who realize that the world can survive and progress only if peoples co-operate, pooling their knowledge and their resources.

The United Nations were right to call for the celebration of this stage in the history of the world, during which a new civilization is being established on the basis of international co-operation.

We cannot help trying to imagine what the founders of the Union of International Associations would have felt if they had known of such solemn recognition. In 1912, in the early UIA publications, they wrote : " After the many big political, scientific, economic, technical and social transformations which took place in the 19th century, it is the destiny of the 20th century to give to the civilized world a new general structure, better adapted to the

new conditions... This structure will take into account both the relations between nations and the relations between more and more specialized interests. It will increase tenfold the strength of collective groups and will make internationalism a factor in civilization".

They founded the UIA specifically to show how the movement towards international organization was developing, and to secure comprehension of the fact that over and above all international achievements, in whatever sector of activity, humanity was irresistibly moved by the need for agreement, unity and association.

The aim of International Co-operation Year must be not only to celebrate but to consolidate the process of internationalization and this process has been accelerating rapidly in the last few years.

In fifteen years the number of independent States participating in the work of the United Nations has indeed greatly increased. The fact is well known, but a few comments, comparing the position in 1964 with that of 1951, may help to bring it more vividly to mind.

As regards membership of the United Nations themselves, we now have 34 independent African Member-States as against four in 1951; 25 American States as against 22; 20 Asian against 16; and 31 European against 16. In fact, of the five continents only the Australasian quota of two remains unchanged.

On 31 December 1963 there were 112 Member-States of the United Nations compared with 60 in 1951, that is to say a nearly two-fold increase within twelve years.

In spite of the considerable development that has taken place during this last decade in the sphere of regional co-operation — one-third of international non-governmental organizations and half of inter-governmental organizations are regional in character — the geographical expansion of the universal-type international organizations is a general phenomenon, to be found both in the case of the United Nations Specialized Agencies as well as in the case of the international non-governmental organizations.

Admittedly, the number of new independent states has risen rapidly in the last 12 years. The figures given above, however, serve to emphasize another fact, namely the general desire on the part of States to avoid living outside the international community. The latter is becoming a reality; it has a structure, it has aims, and it is trying, however feebly as yet, to assemble the means whereby effective action can take place.

Let us hope that the next step — once the joining stage has been completed — will see the blossoming of a genuine spirit of co-operation between states.

That is what all peoples want, the world over, and the contribution of international non-governmental organizations in the work of the inter-governmental bodies is inspired and sustained by belief in the greatness of the task of the United Nations and the Specialized Agencies.

Their hopes must not be disappointed.

LA 10^e ÉDITION DE L'ANNUAIRE DES ORGANISATIONS INTERNATIONALES EST DÉDIÉE A L'ANNÉE DE LA COOPÉRATION INTERNATIONALE

Seuls ceux qui ont vécu le début des rencontres, des prises de conscience et des actions par-dessus les frontières et les intérêts nationaux, pourraient comprendre pleinement ce que représente la décision des Nations Unies de faire de l'année 1965, l'*« Année de la Coopération Internationale »*.

Elle se place juste un siècle et demi après les premiers efforts, ceux des hommes généreux qui luttaient pour obtenir des plénipotentiaires du Congrès de Vienne la proclamation de l'abolition du commerce des esclaves, comme ceux des économistes lucides qui leur firent reconnaître le principe de la libre navigation pour les navires de toutes les nations sur les fleuves internationaux.

Un siècle et demi d'initiatives audacieuses, de luttes patientes, de dévouements par-dessus les égoïsmes, les craintes et surtout les incompréhensions.

C'est en songeant à tous ceux, promoteurs et chevilles ouvrières des réunions et organisations internationales, qui depuis 150 ans ont servi la marche du monde vers l'unité et le progrès, que nous avons dédié cette 10^e édition de l'Annuaire des Organisations Internationales à l'*« Année de la Coopération Internationale »*.

Les 179 organisations intergouvernementales et 1718 organisations internationales non gouvernementales décrites dans le présent volume, sont le résultat de leur foi et de leur lutte. Le Who's Who in International Organizations, publié en complément de l'Annuaire, mentionne les noms de quelque 12.000 dirigeants de ces organisations. En fait, il représentent des millions de personnes de tous les pays qui aujourd'hui savent que le monde ne peut survivre et progresser que dans la solidarité des peuples et la mise en commun de leurs connaissances et entreprises.

Les Nations Unies ont eu raison de considérer qu'il convenait de célébrer l'avènement de cette étape dans l'histoire du monde; l'instauration d'une civilisation nouvelle basée sur la coopération internationale.

Nous ne pouvons nous empêcher d'imaginer les sentiments qu'éprouveraient les fondateurs de l'Union des Associations Internationales, s'ils avaient pu connaître cette reconnaissance solennelle. En 1962, dans les premières publications de l'U.A.I., ils écrivaient : « Après les grandes et nombreuses transformations politiques, scientifiques, économiques, techniques et sociales opérées au XIX^e siècle, le XX^e siècle s'annonce comme devant donner à la communauté civilisée une structure générale nouvelle mieux adaptée aux conditions nouvelles.

« Cette structure tiendra compte à la fois des relations entre les nations et des relations entre les intérêts de plus en plus spécialisés. Elle découplera les forces des collectivités et fera de l'internationalisme un facteur de la civilisation. »

Ils ont fondé l'U.A.I., précisément pour faire mieux voir le mouvement de l'organisation internationale et faire comprendre que par-dessus toutes les réalisations internationales dans un secteur ou l'autre de l'activité humaine, l'humanité était irrésistiblement mue par un besoin d'entente, d'unité et d'association.

L'Année de la Coopération Internationale veut non seulement célébrer mais aussi consolider le processus d'internationalisation, qui a d'ailleurs pris ces dernières années une accélération remarquable.

En effet, depuis 15 ans, le nombre des Etats indépendants qui participent à l'activité des Nations Unies a beaucoup augmenté. Le fait est bien connu, mais nous pensons qu'il est intéressant de donner quelques précisions à cet égard, en rapprochant la situation de 1964 de celle de 1951.

En ce qui concerne l'adhésion à l'Organisation des Nations Unies, nous avons aujourd'hui 34 Etats africains indépendants membres des Nations Unies au lieu de 4 en 1951 ; 25 Etats américains au lieu de 22; 20 Etats asiatiques au lieu de 16; 31 Etats européens au lieu de 16. Le chiffre des 2 Etats australasiens est seul à n'avoir pas changé.

Au total, à la date du 31 décembre 1963, 112 Etats étaient membres des Nations Unies pour 60 en 1951, soit une augmentation de près du double en l'espace de douze ans.

En dépit du développement considérable survenu durant cette dernière décennie en matière de coopération régionale — le tiers des organisations internationales non gouvernementales et la moitié des organisations intergouvernementales sont de caractère régional — l'extension géographique des organisations internationales de caractère universel est un phénomène général, qui se retrouve dans les Institutions spécialisées des Nations Unies aussi bien que dans les organisations internationales non gouvernementales.

Certes, durant ces douze années, le nombre des nouveaux pays indépendants a largement augmenté. Cependant, les chiffres que nous venons de mentionner soulignent surtout un

autre fait, à savoir le désir général de la part des Etats de ne pas vivre en dehors de la communauté internationale. Celle-ci devient une réalité; elle possède une structure, des objectifs et tente au mieux, encore faiblement sans doute, de réunir des moyens d'action.

Espérons que le développement suivant — une fois atteint le stade des affiliations — sera l'épanouissement d'un véritable esprit de coopération entre les Etats.

C'est ce que les peuples du monde entier demandent et toute la contribution des organisations internationales non gouvernementales à l'activité des organisations intergouvernementales, est inspirée et soutenue par la conviction de la grandeur de leur tâche.

Il faut prendre garde à ne pas les décevoir.



THE ASIA PACIFIC ACADEMY OF OPHTHALMOLOGY

*Its background, its aims and accomplishments, and its influence in
ophthalmology*

in Asia and Australasia

The idea for the organization of the Asia Pacific Academy of Ophthalmology grew out of the realization that eye surgeons in neighbouring countries of Asia, Australasia and Oceania were faced with identical ophthalmological problems. The discovery of new and effective preventive measures, improved methods of diagnosis, the use of antibiotics, cortical hormones and a host of other drugs and safer operative techniques, required modern teaching resources and facilities compatible with the level of modern medical science and practice.

Developments in the practice of ophthalmology in the Asia Pacific region were influenced partly by geographic proximity and partly by cultural links between the countries. It appeared that solutions of ophthalmologic problems peculiar to Asia and Australasia were more readily available in Tokyo, Madras and Melbourne than in London, Paris, Vienna or New York. Thus, it appeared desirable and indeed essential that ophthalmologists practicing in neighbouring countries of Asia share their knowledge, discoveries and skills.

The far reaching potentials of regional ophthalmologic cooperation in Oceania, Asia and Australasia were recognized by a group of eye surgeons who had attended the XVIIIth International Congress of Ophthalmology held in Brussels in 1958. There they joined forces and under the name of the Asia Pacific Academy of Ophthalmology, they outlined their principal objectives, defined their geographical boundaries and set a date and place for their First Congress.

The First Congress held in Manila in 1960, was an unqualified success. During this Congress it became obvious that among the most valuable of the mechanisms furthering international exchange of medical "knowledge", were medical assemblies. These brought together practicing ophthalmologists and outstanding scientists from all over the world. They discussed the current state of knowledge and probable future lines of productive inquiry. Our First Congress in Manila and our Second Congress in Melbourne proved to be invaluable facets of scientific communication. They encouraged both the exchange of information and the discussion and planning of collaborative studies. In addition to professional benefits derived from such meetings they contributed to international understanding, goodwill and personal friendships.

In the intervening four years since the Manila Congress, through the cooperation and participation of the leaders in ophthalmology in the Asia Pacific area, the educational, scientific and cultural impact of this academy became increasingly evident. The Asia Pacific Academy was instrumental in arranging and sponsoring study and lecture trips between East and West. At the Melbourne Congress in April 1964, through the medium of the Academy, the Australian Government sponsored the trips of Dr. Robert Loh of Singapore and Dr. Daeng of Thailand through its Colombo Plan. The St. Kilda Lions Club near Melbourne sponsored the visit of one of Ceylon's leading ophthalmologists, Dr. Sivasubramaniam.

Though not necessarily goals, but pleasant and highly rewarding accomplishments of the Asia Pacific Academy of Ophthalmology are personal friendships. Through its facilities, we have all made good friends from Tokyo to Singapore and from Quezon City to Auckland. Such friendships are more than superficial acquaintances they are deep, lasting and meaningful. They have opened our eyes and hearts to a part of science or art which we had not known before, and enabled us to understand a neighbour as a neighbour. These friendships also benefit our patients. As jet transportation continues to shrink the world, patients with eye diseases who find it necessary to travel can now be referred with confidence to a competent friend and colleague in the countries of Asia, and the Pacific.

The APAO has also established informal working relations with the World Health Organization. This was done on the recommendation of Dr. I. C. Fang, Regional Director for the Western Pacific of the World Health Organization. Dr. Fang suggested that in this moreover, a strong international non-governmental organization such as ours could have ready access to scientific information, available only through the World Health Organization. It may be of interest to note that the World Health Organization strongly favors the organization and holding of regional medical conferences as a first step toward the advancement of medical education.

Prevention of needless blindness ranks high in the aims of the Asia Pacific Academy of Ophthalmology. We are particularly fortunate in having our Vice-President, Professor Ida Mann and a member of our Advisory Group, Dr. Phillips Thygeson, serve on the World Health Organization's expert committee on trachoma. Professor Mann in 1962 conducted an eight week post-graduate course at the Gandhi Eye Hospital in Aligarh, India on this highly infectious, yet preventable blinding eye disease. Professor Thygeson at the completion of the Melbourne Congress left for Taiwan for a trachoma survey under the auspices of the World Health Organization.

The Prevention of Blindness in the Asia Pacific area was the principal theme of our 1964 Congress. Doctors Siva Reddy and R. Ebenezer

of India, Dr. Akira Nakajima of Japan, Doctors Samran Wangspa and Daeng Kancharayana of Thailand, Dr. Robert Loh of Singapore, Dr. John Chong of Hong Kong and Dr. Gillies of Australia have presented interesting, stimulating and thought-provoking papers on their experiences with preventable blindness in their countries. Dr. A. L. Rizutti of New York, noted expert on corneal transplantation left for Jaipur, India to establish a clinic on corneal transplantation. Four prominent Victorian Eye Specialists have donated drugs, surgical instruments and their time, and participated in mobile eye clinics in India. The Academy has also been responsible for making arrangements for volunteer ophthalmologists to work in Vietnam and Indonesia for varying periods of time.

An important forward step in the dissemination of ophthalmic knowledge in Asia and the Pacific region was the successful launching of the Oriental Archives of Ophthalmology under the dynamic leadership of Dr. L. P. Agarwal of India and a distinguished group of associate editors from the countries of Asia and the Pacific. This periodical fills a gap. It constitutes an effective medium for the exchange of common problems as well as new discoveries and techniques among ophthalmologists in neighbouring countries and the rest of the world.

Research in ophthalmology continues to open new vistas and even in the lifetime of our youngest colleagues, has wrought miracles. The Ophthalmic Research Institute of Australia has a long list of challenging, worthwhile projects which it has completed during its relatively short existence. Much valuable research has also been carried out in Japan and India. Ophthalmologists from different countries interested in similar problems, and ophthalmologists collaborating with scientists from different disciplines created harmony and bonds of understanding, and pushed back the frontiers of knowledge. The Asia Pacific Academy has facilitated this process through improved communications among its members. Recently our Academy has been given an opportunity to review preliminary plans for international collaborative research on glaucoma, diabetes and high blood pressure affecting the eye.

In conclusion it is suggested that probably never before in human history was there such a

world-wide acceptance of the universal global role to medicine in human progress, as there is now.

The Asia Pacific Academy of Ophthalmology represents a visible proof that ophthalmologists from one country enrich the lives and broaden the horizons of ophthalmologists from other countries. It represents a tangible demonstration of cooperation among eye surgeons of diverse origins working together with mutual

respect and consideration towards common goals.

Ophthalmology to which the nations look for guidance in their physical and social development, should not be Japanese ophthalmology or Indian or Filipino or Australian. It should draw from all appropriate sources and bring all the various elements together into one ever progressing world-wide ophthalmological heritage, common to all humanity.

L'ACADEMIE D'OPHTALMOLOGIE POUR L'ASIE ET LE PACIFIQUE

L'idée de créer l'Académie d'Ophtalmologie pour l'Asie et le Pacifique prit naissance lorsque les médecins des régions d'Asie, d'Australasie et d'Océanie eurent à combattre les mêmes maladies des yeux. 

L'Académie organise des voyages d'études. Des personnalités y prennent part. Ainsi, de réels contacts amicaux se développent, de Tokyo à Singapour et de Quezon City à Auckland.

L'Académie s'est fixée comme une de ses tâches essentielles, l'étude pour la prévention de la cécité, qui constitua le thème principal de son congrès tenu cette année à Melbourne. De nombreux médecins de grande réputation y assistèrent.

Sous le nom d'Archives Orientales d'Ophtalmologie, le Dr. L. P. Agarwal de l'Inde, a favorisé la publication de nouvelles découvertes techniques.

Le succès de l'Académie est une preuve tangible de ce que des ophtalmologues d'un pays enrichissent la vie et élargissent l'horizon de leurs confrères d'un autre pays. C'est une démonstration pratique de coopération entre spécialistes travaillant ensemble dans le respect mutuel et à la poursuite de buts communs.
