
Figure 10.1.1.18. North Atlantic Treaty Organization (NATO)

Aims: Reaffirm the faith of the parties to the Treaty in the purposes and principles of the Charter of the United Nations and their desire to live in peace with all peoples and all governments; safeguard the freedom, common heritage, and civilization of their peoples, founded on the principles of democracy, individual liberty, and the rule of law; promote stability and well-being in the North Atlantic area; unite their efforts for collective defence and for the preservation of peace and security; settle international disputes by peaceful means, in order to avoid endangering international peace, security and justice; refrain from the threat or use of force in any way which would not be consistent with the purposes of the United Nations; eliminate conflict in international economic policies and encourage economic collaboration between member countries. NATO's essential purpose is to safeguard the freedom and security of all its members by political and military means in accordance with the principles of the United Nations Charter.
