These tables, reprinted from the previous edition, indicate the language pairs spoken by leading people in international organizations (using data collected in 1995 and 1999 for the *Who's Who in International Organizations* (UIA, 1996 and 2000 respectively). People may speak more than two languages. Someone who speaks three languages, for example, would have three language pairs.

The same top ten languages appear in 1996 and 2000: Arabic, Dutch, English, French, German, Italian, Portuguese, Russian, Spanish, and Swedish (alphabetical order). They are listed in the entries of more than 100 biographees sampled in 1995 and 70 biographees in 1999. The tables below give totals for paired combinations of these 10 languages. For example, 1673 biographees in 1996 include English and French in the list of languages they speak, 57 include Italian and Portuguese, and 18 include Spanish and Swedish.

The frequency of language pairs, and the change from 1995 to 2000, are also given as percentages of the total samples.
