

## Figure 7.2.2. Organizations: structure and leadership Leading people in international organizations – languages: 2002

These figures, reproduced from *Who' Who in International Organizations*, 4<sup>th</sup> edition, are based on the entries of the 1,724 biographees that contain information on language skills.

Breakdowns are given for male and female biographees; however, because gender is not always known to the editors, the figure given in the column "Both" may be greater than the sum of the columns "Men" and "Women". This figure also gives the total number of organizations (from the *Yearbook of International Organizations*) listed in the entries of these biographees.

It should be noted that the figures in this figure are derived from information provided by the biographees themselves; according to general policy, the editors took people at their word and made no effort to check the accuracy of the claims.

### Figure 7.2.2. (a) Most frequently listed languages

The following 85 languages are listed in the entries of 2 or more biographees. Breakdowns are given for male and female biographees; however, because gender is not always known to the editors, the figure given in the column "Both" may be greater than the sum of the columns "Men" and "Women".

Ten languages are listed in the entries of more than 80 biographees. This table gives totals for combinations of these ten languages. For example, 1 biographee includes Arabic and Dutch in the list of languages in which he or she is proficient. 1182 biographees include English and French, 45 include Italian and Portuguese, and 22 include Spanish and Swedish.
